

7.7-Month-Old DFU Healed in 5 Weeks with 8 VHT Treatments

The Patient

Patrick is a 51-year-old controlled diabetic male with a 10-year history of DFUs, non-healing surgical wounds, and multiple toe amputations. Patrick sought out Dr. Galperin specifically for VHT treatment.

Wound Evaluation

- X-rays ruled out any abnormal findings
- Full thickness wound with a moderate degree of callous formation surrounding
- Erythema
- Undermining, without signs of infection or tunneling
- Vascular assessment and temperature gradient was within normal limits

Previous Treatments

Patrick was previously treated by two other wound care specialists for over 7 months for this wound. Before starting with Dr. Galperin, his medical team provided:

- Standard Wound Care
- Daily dressings
- Topical antibiotics
- Surgical shoe offloading
- Biological grafts
